Access to Documents Request: Ref. GestDem No 2019/5444

We are writing to follow up on your email dated 16 March 2020, in which you asked for "a delay of two weeks to both allow [Commission] staff to get accustomed to this new working context and to work out the necessary internal coordination" to respond to our request. You never followed-up to our request after that communication.

Therefore, our request is still pending.

Considering the time that has elapsed since our initial request on 18 September 2019, we would like to facilitate its handling as soon as possible. For this purpose, **we would hereby like to submit a refined version of our initial request, under Regulation 1049/2001, as follows:**

In accordance with Article 15(3) of the consolidated version of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union and Article 42 of the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the EU, implemented through Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, Privacy International and [REDACTED] private capacity as EU citizen, would hereby like to jointly request a copy of the following documents that are held by your institution:

- Documents pertaining to any kind of impact assessments (human rights impact assessments, including privacy or data protection impact assessments, due diligence assessments, audit reports or any other risk assessment) that were produced in the context of transfer of surveillance capabilities by the European Union to third countries.

Clarifications

Transfer of surveillance capabilities should mean: i) transfer of surveillance technology or equipment from the EU to third countries; ii) training of authorities of third countries on using surveillance technology/equipment/techniques; iii) providing financial support to third countries to purchase surveillance technology/equipment or to carry out surveillance; iv) supporting the drafting/adoption/enactment of surveillance legislation in third countries.

Third countries should mean the following non-EU countries: Turkey, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Albania, Serbia, Kosovo, Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as any African country.

We thank you in advance for the prompt handling of our request and we remain fully at your disposal should you require any further information. Should you want us to further refine our request, please get back to us in due course proposing specific suggestions on how to best do that in a way that would help us reach a fair solution.
